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
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
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A Free Medical Screening Program for Former Lawrence Livermore, Sandia California, and Lawrence Berkeley, National Laboratory Workers



As a Lawrence Livermore, Sandia California, or Lawrence Berkeley, National Laboratory Worker, you may have been exposed to radiation and toxic substances, such as asbestos and beryllium. Even if you did not handle toxic substances directly, you may be at an elevated risk for occupational illness.

Doctors trained in occupational medicine test for work-related illnesses that other physicians may overlook.

The purpose of the medical screening is to detect work-related illnesses as early as possible, when medical treatment may be more effective. Trained occupational medicine physicians at a local Kaiser Permanente facility will take your occupational and medical history and give you a complete physical exam, a chest X-ray, hearing and breathing tests and blood work, including a beryllium blood test (BeLPT) that detects beryllium sensitivity. Doctors will look for work-related illnesses, including:

- Asbestosis
- Chronic beryllium disease
- Emphysema
- Hearing loss
- Silicosis
- Some cancers

After your local examination is completed, independent occupational health physicians, located at Queens College of the City University of New York, will review the exam. You will be provided with a written results letter advising you of any abnormalities and recommending follow-up care when appropriate. These result letters may help with Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Program Act (EEOICPA) or state workers' compensation claims. None of the doctors in the WHPP program are employed by or affiliated with the DOE or its contractors. Your medical information will remain **confidential**.

Even if you feel healthy, you should participate in the WHPP medical screening program.

You may not have noticeable symptoms if an illness is in an early stage. Even if you are not feeling sick, the WHPP screening may identify work-related health problems, for which early medical intervention can make a difference. There is also a general wellness component of the exam to test for non-occupationally related conditions such as elevated cholesterol and high blood pressure. While important for your overall health, these conditions are *not* compensable.



It is Easy to Participate.

You are eligible to participate if you, worked at the Lawrence Livermore, Sandia California, and/or Lawrence Berkeley, National Laboratories for one year or more of cumulative time, or if you ever worked for any period of time in construction or maintenance at the lab(s). You may also be eligible if you have health concerns that you believe are related to exposures you had while working at the lab(s).

Screenings are conveniently held at several Kaiser Occupational Health clinics in the Tri-Valley area. You do not have to be a Kaiser member in order to participate.

Participants are eligible for repeat medical examinations every three years. Call 1-866-460-0628 or 1-877-653-1962 today.

A private telephone interview will be scheduled for you to discuss your work history and determine appropriate medical tests for the screening. There is no cost to participate. However, the program does not cover follow-up medical testing or travel expenses.
